About the Work

In the Bates-Hendricks neighborhood of Indianapolis, Indiana, there is a quiet residential street with a wide median adorned with colorful foliage and a stepping stone path. Nestled in the center of the median is a tiny wooden shelter with a vaulted ceiling and steeple. Within this open-air structure resides a community piano that thoughtful neighbor places outside during the spring and summer for the community to enjoy. A local sanctuary. This is where I wrote "Good News!"

For centuries, Christmas carols have enriched the Advent season with their captivating storytelling and tuneful melodies. These songs hold a special place in the hearts of many, primarily because of their comforting familiarity. My aim was to make "Good News!" resonate like a beloved carol that audiences already know and enjoy. By blending techniques from the 18th to the 21st century, this composition evokes the joy and anticipation of Christ's birth.

Performance Notes

If the optional parts are unavailable, this piece may be performed with choir and piano only. Full instrumentation (including C instrument, chimes, and tambourine) is recommended as it elevates the celebratory feel and blended styles. Any C instrument may be used and registers may be changed to best suit the instrument. An oboe or flute would best evoke the French carol style. If using a flute, the majority of the music should be played an octave higher than written. This adaptability offers performers and directors a range of options to suit their preferences and style.

Daniel Watson is a versatile composer, teacher, and musician from Indianapolis, Indiana. Inspired by the beauty of the natural world, Watson's music challenges performers and audiences to heighten their senses through sound. His first choral masterwork, Virtues and Vices, premiered at the University of Indianapolis in 2024, commissioned by Sound Ecologies Inc. In 2023, he won the Indianapolis Symphonic Choir National Christmas Carol Commission Competition with his work "Good News!". Watson has had the privilege of performing, directing, and premiering compositions at Carnegie Hall, The Kennedy Center, and venues throughout Great Britain, France, Switzerland, Austria, Germany, and the United States. He continues to be commissioned for new works for professional, collegiate, high school, and middle school singers.

Watson has been recognized for his dedication to music education with the Outstanding Future Music Educator of the Year Award (2015) from the Indiana Music Education Association and the National Professional Achievement Award (2014, 2015) from the National Association for Music Education. He is the Director of Choirs at Greenwood Community High School, Associate Faculty of Music at Indiana University Indianapolis, and the owner of Daniel Watson Music LLC (danielscottwatson.com). He maintains an active private music studio (voice, piano, composition) and regularly collaborates in the community through conducting, piano and vocal performance, and composing.
